We're so happy that in this anniversary year you're continuing to support seriously ill children with Gift of Life. Back in 2011 our charity was registered in the UK to help patients of Podari Zhizn beat cancer. In 2021 this sister charity of ours, which has been a pioneer in helping children in Russia with oncological and haematological diseases, completed its fifteenth year!

Podari Zhizn has now supported more than 73,000 children and young people, and thanks to Gift of Life the charity's patients continue year after year to receive life-saving drugs from abroad which are not available in Russia.

From the bottom of our hearts, we want to thank all our friends, partners and benefactors for their long-term support of both charities and for the unfailing help they have shown to children and young adults being treated for oncological, haematological and immunological diseases in Russian hospitals over the course of all these years.

During 2021 Gift of Life supported 49 children and teenagers. The support which we provided at a cost of £611,515 not only helped children to receive the most modern and effective treatment and the chance of recovery, but also brought hope to their families, and the possibility of fulfilling dreams and plans for the future.

# Our mission

Gift of Life was established in the UK in 2011 as a sister charity to Podari Zhizn, a leading Russian children's cancer charity founded by actresses Chulpan Khamatova and Dina Korzun.

Our mission is to ensure every child or young person\* with an oncological or haematological disease can receive the most effective and modern medical care and non-medical support.

# Foreign Medication in 2021

Gift of Life's biggest expense is the regular purchase of drugs which for various reasons are unavailable in Russia. Some of the medications are very rare and the producer is not interested in registering them. Some may be temporarily unavailable on the local market because of supply interruptions. It's important to note that the charity does not itself prescribe drugs to patients. It acts as a funder and follows the prescriptions which are made by the doctors and confirmed by the experts of Podari Zhizn, our sister charity.

In 2021 Gift of Life covered 48 applications for such drugs. As a result, 47 children received help with their treatment.

Thanks to our supporters, Gift of Life managed to supply four children in Russian hospitals with Erwinase, an anticancer drug which is expensive, rare and unavailable in the country, and each of them successfully continued their treatment. Erwinase was first produced in the UK ten years ago and it was precisely with the purchase of this medication that the work of the charity began.

Thus, in October seven-year-old Sasha Zubov from Kaliningrad was discharged home, having completed a long course of this drug (68 vials) in the fight against acute lymphoblastic leukaemia. The doctors at the Russian children's hospital are happy with Sasha's condition, and now he will only be receiving maintenance therapy. And Sasha is happy that he can now live at home again and resume his favourite hobbies – chess and construction. Gift of Life spent £69,116 on Erwinase for Sasha.

Gift of Life also continued to fund the purchase and import of radioactive iodine to treat patients with neuroblastoma. To import this medication, the timing of purchase and delivery must be strictly monitored, which is very complicated to guarantee in times of pandemic. Nonetheless, thanks to the financial support of Gift of Life's benefactors, we managed to make six purchases of this medication for Russian children.

The children who received the medication were three-year-old Salima Tsechoeva, four-year-old Katerina Lebedeva, one-and-a-half-year-old Mata A., two-year-old Mikhail N., ten-year-old Klimenty R. and two-year-old Mark Vorobev. After treatment with radioactive iodine and a bone marrow autotransplant Mark showed a clear improvement, and he has now gone on to the final stage – immunotherapy with the drug Qarziba. This is, incidentally, an extremely expensive medication which earlier was purchased abroad, but has now arrived in Russia and is paid for out of government funding, which makes this innovative treatment much more accessible.

To fight against dangerous fungal infections Gift of Life bought two children an innovative drug called Cresemba. Ten-year-old Dima Ilchenko, who suffers from a congenital defect of the immune system, had complications with infection even before the transplant, and after the boy's bone marrow was transplanted a serious fungal infection set in. However, thanks to medications, including Cresemba, it was possible to save the child's life. In August Dima was discharged home and he will now be able to resume activities at his favourite art school, and in the future fulfil his coveted dream to become a doctor!

In 2021 Gift of Life continued to buy 'emergency' drugs for children after bone marrow transplants: Defitelio, Foscavir, Cidofovir and Probenecid. We can't expect these vitally important drugs to be registered in Russia any time soon: we're talking about quite rare medications, used in a limited number of cases. However, it is essential to purchase them, because for many children with serious post-transplant complications these drugs give the only chance of recovery.

Thus, in September eleven-year-old Mazahir Ismailov was discharged home in a good condition. Mazahir had a serious congenital blood disorder – thalassemia. With this diagnosis recovery is only possible after a bone marrow transplant. Mazahir had a transplant from an unrelated donor in April, and the main complications were viral infections. The drugs Foscavir, Cidofovir and Probenecid made it possible to bring these infections under control.

The charity also made purchases of the drugs Kineret, Busilvex and Tepadina. The later drug is still in the process of being registered, so it is only used in cases where there is no substitute. Thanks to you Tepadina was given to four children who were patients at the Morozov Children’s Hospital and who – like Mazahir Ismailov – needed a bone marrow transplant because of thalassemia.

# Bone marrow transplants

Bone marrow transplants are one of the most important types of treatment for our patients and are used when neither drugs, nor operations, nor chemo, nor radiation therapy give the chances of a complete recovery. They are needed for children with various diagnoses: leukaemia, aplastic anaemia, and primary immunodeficiency. These children have one thing in common: their bone marrow – which is the main organ for producing blood cells and platelets – does not work properly, if at all. It is impossible to cure such a situation, but it is possible to replace it with a different and healthy one – that of the donor. That is the goal of transplant procedures. The transplant procedure itself is usually paid by the government. Unfortunately, however, all the costs associated with the transplant are not covered.

One of the basic costs associated with transplants is the search for an unrelated bone marrow donor on international registers and their activation – that is, harvesting the necessary bone marrow cells from the donor. If there is no suitable donor in the child's family, then it becomes necessary to look for a potential unrelated donor. In Russia around 100,000 names have so far been entered into such registers. That is not enough. Therefore, for most patients finding a donor in Russia doesn't work. It becomes necessary to look abroad, where the creation of registers began much earlier, and where they already contain data about millions of people who are prepared to become donors. And if a donor is selected from abroad, the expense is much more significant. It costs more than £15,000 for each patient. The government does not take on these expenses – since these procedures started in Russia more than 15 years ago, transplants from unrelated donors have depended upon donations from benefactors.

Because of the restrictions associated with the import of biomaterials from donors during the Covid pandemic, there has been a big cutback in the number of bone marrow transplants from foreign donors; this is precisely the type of transplant for which Gift of Life normally pays. On the other hand, the number of patients for whom donors are found on Russian registers is constantly growing, and thanks to the development of technology, the number of transplants from partially matched related donors continues to grow.



**In Russia, about a 1,000 children need transplants a year. Ten years ago, we performed about 400 transplants annually, and now there are almost 700.**

# Help from foreign experts

In 2021 funding from Gift of Life saved the life of two-year-old Kira Fedorova, who was sent for a unique operation in Germany. The infant received treatment for a very serious illness – rhabdomyosarcoma or cancer of the soft tissue. The situation of the tumour made it very difficult to remove without injuring the child. An operation would have to be carried out with the greatest care to protect organs, and so Kira was sent from the Moscow hospital to Tübingen University Hospital, which is rightly considered a benchmark in world medicine.

The foreign treatment cost £22,102. Everything went off very successfully and the tumour was completely removed with minimal trauma. In June Kira was discharged home with no signs of cancer. Now she only needs maintenance therapy to prevent the disease returning.

In addition, the charity paid for sixteen-year-old Alina A. from the Republic of Bashkortostan to have a histological investigation in a leading Italian hospital, the Rizzoli Orthopaedics Institute. The girl has femur cancer.

# Key facts and figures

Every year in Russia around

## 4,500 children

are diagnosed with oncological diseases and serious blood disorders. About 2/3 of the children diagnosed are under 14.

An average of

## 1 in 600

children and teenagers fall ill with cancer or a serious blood disorder before reaching the age of 18.

Each year about

## 1,000

children who are fighting cancer in Russian hospitals could need a bone marrow transplant.

## Leukaemia

is the most widespread form of cancer among children. Childhood leukaemia (in part, acute lymphoblastic leukaemia) appears most often between the ages of two and six years.

Since 2011 the number of bone marrow transplants for children across the country has increased by roughly 80%.

Ten years ago, the 'transplant mortality rate' was roughly 15%. Now doctors have managed to bring down this ratio to 2-3% in cases of leukaemia, which earlier would have seemed impossible.

In Europe and the United States, the survival rate of children with cancer is 90%. In Russia the average is around 70%.

Children's cancer can be cured. We are working to ensure that every child in Russia can receive essential treatment.



# Doctors Professional Development

To avoid making mistakes in diagnosis and treatment, doctors must always be learning. Constant training, study of foreign expertise and knowledge of the latest achievements of modern medicine are all essential for successfully treating children with oncological and haematological diseases.

Thanks to Gift of Life Russian doctors and scientists are able to attend international conferences and congresses to receive the most up-to-date scientific information about children's oncology and haematology, exchange experiences, discuss complicated cases and maintain scientific and medical links. We cover the registration fees, travel costs, subsistence and visas of specialists.

Almost all international educational programmes in 2021 took place online. Fees were paid for specialists from Moscow and Yekaterinburg hospitals, who took part in nine international forums: The European congress of the International Society of Paediatric Oncology (SIOP)

- The annual meeting of the European Bone Marrow Transplant Association (EBMT)
- The seventh World Congress on Vascular Access (WoCoVA)
- The International Paediatric Radiology Congress (IPR)
- The 12th Biennial Childhood Leukaemia and Lymphoma Symposium (CLLS)
- The annual meeting of the International Society for Magnetic Resonance in Medicine (ISMRM) and the Association of Specialists in Magnetic Resonance (SMRT)
- The 25th annual congress of the European Haematology Association (EHA)
- The fourth International Symposium on Childhood, Adolescent and Young Adult Hodgkin Lymphoma (ISCAYAHL)

For doctors and scientists such meetings are a unique opportunity to exchange ideas, which will then be used in scientific research and clinical practice across the world and help save thousands of children's lives every year.



In the autumn of 2021 I took part in online IPR and METANANO conferences with presentations about the development and implementation of new methods of non-invasive assessment of iron overload of the liver using MRI. Such events are useful for the practical objectives of our department and have a positive effect on the international image of the Dmitry Rogachev Centre and the whole of Russian science, because the presentations were thought highly of in the international scientific community.

In 2021 Gift of Life also funded certified translations into Russian of two internationally recognised manuals on acute lymphoblastic leukaemia (the cost of the translation coming to £5,498.56) and acute myeloid leukaemia (£3,887).

For more than 20 years manuals about the main oncological diseases have been published by the National Comprehensive Cancer Network (NCCN), an authoritative non-profit in the United States, which brings together 28 leading American oncological centres. Thanks to Gift of Life manuals about leukaemia are now also available for millions of Russian-speaking patients, who will be able to receive the most reliable information about their diseases, and to thousands of oncologists in Russia.



# Our aims and plans

In 2021 we continued to work amid the difficult conditions of the Covid pandemic. One of the main challenges was the significant restriction on international travel. This affected the supply of certain medical drugs, the transport of donor biomaterial and foreign trips of medical specialists. Nonetheless, we managed to gradually overcome the many difficulties and **in the New Year we will continue to actively work on all four of Gift of Life's programmes.**

One of the main focuses of the charity's programmes, which accounts for 90% of our spending, is ensuring that children and young people with oncological diseases receive vital medications which are not registered or are temporarily unavailable in Russia.

The needs of children in the care of Podari Zhizn, our sister charity in Russia, for such medications represent about £3 million a year. Gift of Life already covers up to 20% of the essential sums, and with your help we hope to increase this item of expenses in the new year.

It's very important to the charity to have a supply of money in the account to immediately acquire 'emergency' medicines. After all, children don't get sick to schedule. Sometimes each day counts. Therefore, our priority will be to create a medical reserve to cover essential costs for emergency applications.

It's only through the regular support of our donors that there is a chance for us to meet these needs, and for children to return to healthy, full lives. Thank you for standing with us!

In its second decade Gift of Life is also taking a new direction. With your help we are planning to support an infrastructure project of Podari Zhizn: the Izmalkovo Village, hospital retreat for children.

Izmalkovo Village is going to be a special place, where young patients can stay with their parents in a home-like environment, whilst waiting for their planned treatment at leading hospitals in the area. The construction of the retreat in Moscow region near the village of Peredelkino has already started. Thanks to the project another 400 children a year will be able to receive medical help in Dmitry Rogachev Centre, as its throughput capacity will grow by 15-20%. And that means that hundreds more children's lives will be able to be saved.

In the best western hospitals, the separation between treatment and accommodation makes for the most effective organisational model. Thanks to Podari Zhizn this expertise will now be applied in Russia.

After the construction of the Izmalkovo Village, even more children will be able to receive prompt and effective treatment. **We are therefore preparing to perpetuate the name of each benefactor who contributes to this noble work.** We would like every lodge on the property of the Izmalkovo Village to carry the name of the person or the company who contributed to its construction.





# Corporate Partnership Opportunities

## Corporate Gift Aid

Companies are entitled to tax relief for qualifying charitable donations made to charities. The donations are paid gross without the deduction of income tax. The donations are deductible from the company's total profits in the year in which the donations are made.

## Payroll Giving

Boost your corporate responsibility by engaging your employees in giving and providing a regular income stream to Gift of Life, without having to pay a penny. Payroll Giving is a flexible, tax-effective way for your employees to donate to the causes they care about straight from their pay. It must be paid through PAYE from someone's wages. You can also increase employee engagement by matching the funds they donate. Some companies offer this on a pound-for-pound basis, while others will specify the amount they're prepared to give. The scheme is simple to set up, easy to administer and can be customised to suit your matching criteria.

## Dine For Good

You can add a discretionary charitable donation (£1 or another sum) to the bill of each customer. It's totally voluntary and of course, some guests may opt out, but we hope that many will choose to show their support. Marketing materials about the cause with the bill or on the menu will help your customers to see how they are helping children with cancer. As an alternative you can dedicate an item on the menu (e.g. a dessert, drink or other dish) to Gift of Life and donate the proceedings. Whatever your preferred choice is, it will both provide invaluable support for those whose lives depend upon it, as well as show your customers your credentials as a reliable, caring business with a proven reputation for social responsibility.

## Contactless Donations

You can fund an installation of a modern contactless device to collect donations for Gift of Life from your clients and customers. It can be positioned on the shop till, beauty salon or gallery reception desk, café bar or sports club. A compact device accepts donations offline, enabling you to fundraise in areas with no mobile signal or Wi-Fi.




